PROGRAM DRIVERS

- **Army Secretariat for Installations and Environment- (ASA (I&E)) published initial Army Environmental Cleanup Strategy in April 2003**
 - **Unified past (DERP) and ongoing (compliance-related) cleanup**
 - **Directed Assistant Chief of Staff for Installation Management (ACSIM) to develop Environmental Cleanup Strategic Plan**



PROGRAM DRIVERS

- **Army Secretariat - ASA (I&E) published Army Environmental Compliance-Related Cleanup Eligibility Guidelines on June 18, 2004**
 - **Guidelines for the development and implementation of programs to effectively and efficiently manage Compliance Related Cleanup at Army installations in the United States and Overseas**
 - **Response actions on sites not under the Defense Environmental Restoration Program (Post October 1986)**
 - **Designated the program managers for Compliance-related Cleanup**



PROGRAM MANAGERS

- **Defense Environmental Restoration Program**

- ER,A Funding
- DoD primacy
- Required Public involvement
- Some permit relief
- Higher cost projects
- Long-term cleanups
- Defense State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA)

- **Compliance-related Cleanup Program**

- O&M or Mission Funds
- Regulator primacy
- Limited public involvement
- No permit relief
- Lower cost projects
- Short-term cleanups
- No DSMOA



Summary

- **Installations always had Compliance-related Cleanup Sites**
 - Each site is now individually identifiable
- **Several Program Managers for Compliance-related Cleanup**
- **The Operations and Maintenance or Mission Funds used for Compliance-related Cleanup also fund the entire Compliance Program (where applicable)**
 - Implement Spill Prevention, Control and Countermeasures Plan
 - RCRA hazardous waste storage and management
 - Compliance-related Cleanup
- **Non-DERP Environmental Liabilities reported on Army financial statement Note 14**
