INTERSERVICE ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION REVIEW BOARD TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

Training in cultural resources management and associated areas is available through courses approved by the Department of Defense Interservice Environmental Education Review Board (ISEERB). These include courses offered directly by ISEERB or other federal agencies, such as the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation.

ISEERB offerings include:

- Natural Resources Compliance
- Introduction to Cultural Resources Management Laws and Regulations
- Historic Preservation Law and Section 106 Compliance
- Native American Traditions and Cultures, and
- National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Application.

ADVISORY COUNCIL ON HISTORIC PRESERVATION TRAINING

The Advisory Council on Historic Preservation offers "Introduction to Section 106 Review." This two-day introductory course provides information about federal compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.

U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS PROSPECT TRAINING

Cultural Resources: Identification, Analysis, and Evaluation is a proponent sponsored engineer corps training (PROSPECT) course offered by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. It provides an overview of cultural resources management and compliance requirements.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers also offers courses in historic building preservation. *Historic Structures:*

Maintenance and Repair provides an awareness of the unique characteristics, legal requirements, procedures, technical knowledge and skills necessary to maintain and repair historic buildings.
