SUBJECT: Amendment to Installation Environmental Plans to Include Resources

Reference a. requires installations to develop Installation Pollution Preventions Plans; it also requires that installations develop a management and funding plan to correct the deficiencies identified during environmental assessments. References b. and c. require an Integrated Natural Resources Management Plan and an Integrated Cultural Resources Management Plans. Reference e. requires the development of the Installation Action Plan. Reference f. clarifies germane portions of reference a. and reaffirms the requirements to develop Installation Corrective Action Plans. References g., signed by Vice Chief of Staff, Army and the Under Secretary of the Army directs specific actions based on recommendations resulting from the Senior Environmental Leadership Conference, March 2000 (SELC 2000).

3. The senior leaders at the SELC 2000 noted that there was a disconnect between goals articulated in the various installation plans and the budgeting process, including the Program Objective Memorandums (POM). They recommended that guidance be issued requiring linkage between plans and resources.

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4. Pursuant to reference g., MACOMs will take the actions necessary to implement the following requirements in their installation environmental plans. These plans will:
  - a. Articulate the desired end state that individual plan goals seek to reach
  - b. cover at least five years of resourcing
  - c. include a section (e.g., an appendix, chapter, etc) that lays out the funding required to achieve the established goals for each of the years covered
  - d. be signed by the installation commander
5. The intent of the funding section of each plan is to link resources with the goals established. The funding section of each plan will therefore be used to develop and support Environmental Program Requirements and POM submissions. Managers should be aware that their environmental plans may represent only a part of their total environmental requirements; resourcing documents should be augmented accordingly. Further 5-year plans will normally only impact two years of a POM cycle; it is therefore crucial that plans be continuously updated to sustain their value.
6. This memorandum does not give rise to new environmental plans. Current plans or those under development should be amended to satisfy the above requirements prior to 30 September 2002.
