Purple Amole
(*Chlorogalum purpureum*)

Habitat: Oak woodlands and grasslands of the Santa Lucia Range in California.

A perennial lily that grows from a bulb up to a height of 16 inches; the underground bulb has many husky layers.

The only member of the genus *Chlorogalum* with bluish-purple flowers that open during daytime hours.

Native Americans used the bulbs to make soap, brushes, and arrow glue.

Listed as threatened on March 20, 2000.
