Earth Day Tree Dedication and Flower Planting Ceremony



The Earth Day Tree 2007 of the Mannheim Military Community is a common ash (*Fraxinus excelsior*). The Common Ash is a 20-35m tall tree, native to most of Europe.



Tree is watered with fertilizer.



Flowers are planted around the tree.



Environmental Awareness Training at Schools



The Environmental Management Division visited the Mannheim Military Community's schools during Earth Week to talk about Recycling, Energy and Water Conservation.



Environmental Field Trips

Together with the schools, the Environmental Management Division organized various field trips to places of environmental interest.

Field Trip to the Incineration and Biomass Plant

What happens to our refuse? 5,000 tons of non-recyclable refuse from the Mannheim Military Community is burnt at the incinerator each year.



Field Trip to Yellow Bag Plant at Lachen / Speyerdorf

In 1990, Germany launched the so-called “yellow-bag” system. The idea is to collect, sort and recycle packaging material to reduce the amount of refuse. Approximately 250 tons of “yellow bag waste” such as packaging material made out of plastic, metal, and composites are collected and recycled from the

Field Trip to Heye Glas at Germersheim

Field Trip to Water Works Käfertal

At the water works Käfertal, which provides 40% of the water supply to the city of Mannheim including the USAG Mannheim, ground water is cleaned to provide drinking water.
