The U.S. Army Garrison Daegu Environmental Office hosted the Daegu American School Environmental Sciences Class to a field trip to neighboring Camp Carroll. Students and teachers alike were enthusiastic to see and participate in the many environmental related activities that are carried out on a daily basis. At the Recycling Facility students and teachers filled the can crusher and watched as it crushed aluminum cans into a compact cube. They also viewed a demonstration of the newly acquired shredder that quickly turns yard debris and scrap wood into mulch for landscaping projects while diverting the waste from the landfill. The group also visited the Sewage Treatment Plant, Water Treatment Plant and HAZMART. At the HAZMART Students learned about Antifreeze Recycling and participated in taking pH readings of the finished product. The day concluded with transplanting a cherry tree in a recreational area lacking shade.
