

NCDEQ – Who we are





Mission Statement:

Providing science-based environmental stewardship for the health and prosperity of ALL North Carolinians

The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) is the lead stewardship agency for the protection of North Carolina's environmental resources.



NCDEQ – We have an agreement with DoD



A Defense and State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) is the overarching agreement between DoD and a State that provides a framework to establish partnerships at DoD installations...DSMOA program(s) to reimburse States and Territories for expedited eligible regulatory services, such as technical review of documents, site visits, public participation support, Restoration Advisory Boards, identification and explanation of applicable, relevant and appropriate requirements, and quality assurance/quality control sampling and analysis, which support the DOD in the execution of the Defense Environmental Restoration Programs (DERP) and Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) programs.

The goal of the DSMOA Program is to expedite environmental restoration at Department of Defense (DoD) installations through partnerships with States and Territories.



NCDEQ – Our RAB Responsibilities

The state regulatory RAB member, where applicable, is responsible for:

- Attending RAB meetings and providing input in an open, honest, and constructive manner;
- Serving as an information, referral, and resource bank for communities, installations, and agencies;
- Reviewing documents and other materials related to remediation and restoration;
- Ensuring that state environmental standards and regulations are identified and addressed by the DoD installation (state regulatory member);
- Facilitating flexible and innovative resolutions of environmental issues and concerns where applicable and possible; and
- Assisting in education and training for the RAB members.



Feasibility Study

 The Feasibility Study (FS) uses the data from the Remedial Investigation (RI) to develop, screen, and evaluate remedial action alternatives for a site (APRIL-MAY 2025)

Proposed Plan

 The Proposed Plan summarizes the results of the RI/FS. It presents the preferred cleanup alternative for a site to the public for review and comment (May-June 2025)

Record of Decision

 A Record of Decision (ROD) documents the cleanup selection process and selected remedy in accordance with CERCLA as well as applicable and appropriate regulations and standards

Co-Chair Selection Process


- Received Feedback from 9 community members interested in consideration.
