

Missiles and Space

MISSION
Provide a man-portable, highly lethal, survivable, medium anti-tank weapon system to the infantry, scouts and combat engineers.

DESCRIPTION
Javelin is the first fire-and-forget, shoulder-fired, anti-tank missile now fielded to the Army and Marine Corps. Javelin's unique top-attack flight mode, self-guided tracking system, and advanced warhead design allow it to defeat all known tanks out to a range of 2,500 meters. Special features include a selectable top-attack or direct-fire mode, target lock-on before launch, and a very limited back-blast that enables gunners to fire safely from enclosures and covered fighting positions. The system weighs 49.5 pounds.

All weapon system programs, regardless of acquisition category, shall comply with Environment, Safety and Occupational Health (ESOH) requirements throughout their life cycle. The Army spends approximately \$1.5B per year on environmental quality (EQ) management. Integration of EQ considerations into the acquisition process and system design will reduce that cost and liability to Army installations and commanders.
